




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Size of Population


FDH: Foreign Domestic Helpers

Total EM population: 263,593



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Ethnic Minority Households are Larger




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Ethnic Minorities and Elementary Occupations



Ethnic Minorities Earn Less than the Hong Kong Average





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


Hierarchy of Needs




Maslow's hierarchy of needs

Needs-based additions



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


At the beginning: Stage 1



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April 2020: The problems faced in the community



Understanding the Problems

JOBS

- Lost jobs leading to financial difficulties
- Suboptimal contracts- No paid sick leave

LANGUAGE

- Important information should also be communicated in English
- Lack of communication with others at workplace

HEALTHCARE

- Scared of the COVID-19 virus
- Shortage of masks and other medical supplies
- Mental health issues
- Struggling with medical supplies & medicines.

WELFARE

- Lack of government housing
- High cost of living- High rents, small homes
- Desire more spaces/parks for the kids to play
- Children developing bad habits – smoking, taking drugs, etc.

EDUCATION

- Online learning has been difficult
- Need computers for Home Learning
- Require tutoring for children
- Wish to learn Chinese separately from locals in schools
- High University Fees
- Lack of Scholarships & Internships

DISCRIMINATION

- Lack of understanding of cultural differences
- Shortage of Halal food
- NCS students chased around in schools

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






3. The poor are geographically spread out






4. People are desperate for jobs



- April 2020: We received over 400 applications from ethnic minorities for 3 positions in a new mask factory in Hong Kong.
- Call Mira: Callers mostly want jobs
- On average, 50 calls/messages per day on job enquiries.



5. Household Income is decreasing






6. Meeting basic needs is more difficult

Do you have financial difficulty in meeting your household expenses of rent, food, utilities and children's education?


■ Yes, have difficulties ■ No, we are fine



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7. Lack of Cantonese is a barrier for jobs





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
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8. Financial difficulties result in less education for children

- Many students are discouraged by their parents from having summer internships with top companies. Instead, they are encouraging them to get work immediately.
 - Can earn more at McDonalds (HK\$44/per hour)
- Many have been discouraged to continue their further studies.
 - Family decision to prioritise earning immediately
- Families that had previously allowed their daughters to study, are now changing their mind, wanting them to marry instead.



9. Women are vulnerable and may be on the verge of a crisis



- On average 200 calls per month
- Top issues: Food employment, domestic violence
- Forced marriage has increased.



10. Children are directly impacted

- Increase of phone calls from social workers and parents asking for counselling services for children because children are showing signs of depression and anxiety.
 - Trauma has increased because of the domestic violence increase
- Women are more stressed and so their children are more stressed
- Children lack food, internet access, laptops, and books
- Girl children are being forced to marry earlier.

Simple Ways to Help Us

- It costs just HK\$500 to pay for 2 child trauma counselling sessions with a counsellor in Hindi, Urdu or English. Each session is 45 minutes.
- It costs HK\$1,000 to feed a family of 6 for 3 months.
- It costs HK\$20,000 to contribute to a scholarship to support an EM girl for tertiary education.
