



MOTHERS OF SPECIAL NEEDS CHILDREN

Many of our ethnic minority mothers have a fairly low level of education and have never heard the terms such as ÄUTISM' and ÁDHD', before they were told by the school. They are confused about why their children may be defiant or badly behaved. They blame themselves or feel they have been cursed. They sometimes use very traditional ways of parenting and feel guilty about doing so.

The Zubin Foundation creates a safe place for mothers of special needs ethnic minority children to meet, learn and share. The ultimate aim is for women to be able. to make friends and rely on others for support.



MENTAL HEALTH COUNSELLING

EM WELL-BEING CENTRE

The Zubin Foundation that provides the only mental health counselling service to lower income ethnic minorities in English, Hindi and Urdu. Working with The University of Hong Kong, Department of Psychiatry, we provide 1:1 counselling to service users who suffer from Depression, Anxiety and Stress two days per week, starting in September 2019. We also refer more serious cases to the Hospital Authority for psychiatry intervention through other NGOs we work with.


